4. What is EmployAbility and how to contact them?

The nationwide EmployAbility service provides an employment support service for people with a, health condition, a disability, injury or illness.

The essential feature of the Service: People with disabilities should have the same opportunities to participate in all activities and to work with and alongside other employees who do not have disabilities.

The EmployAbility service also provides support for employers.

- ongoing support for both the employer and employee throughout employment
- a professional job-matching service to help ensure successful recruitment
- advice and information on additional employment supports

Willing Able Mentoring (WAM) is a work placement programme which aims to promote access to the labour market for graduates with disabilities and build the capacity of employers to integrate disability into the mainstream workplace
